John 6:21 (KJV)

“Then they willingly received him into the ship: and immediately the ship was at the land whither they went.”

INTRODUCTION

POWER THAT PRODUCES MOVEMENT

August established a foundational revelation for ASK:

“That I may know him, and the power of his resurrection...”

— Philippians 3:10

The power of God was revealed supremely in the resurrection of Jesus Christ. We explored the power revealed in Christ, His Word, His Name, the Holy Spirit, and His precious blood.

But God's power is not given merely to be admired or discussed.

Power produces movement.

The Christian life is not a static life.

We have been called to walk.

We have been called to run.

We have been called to advance.

We have been called to fulfil assignments.

We have been called to proclaim Christ.

We have been called to make disciples.

We have been called to influence our world for the Kingdom of God.

Therefore, September follows naturally after August.

August: Power.

September: Supernatural Speed.

The same God who empowers His people can also give them unusual capacity to move and advance.

Elijah is one of Scripture's clearest examples.

The Bible does not simply say that Elijah ran.

It first tells us:

“And the hand of the LORD was on Elijah...”

The supernatural movement was preceded by divine empowerment.

This establishes an important principle:

Supernatural speed begins with the hand of God, not the strength of man.

Throughout Scripture we also see moments when God accelerated journeys, hastened fulfilment, restored what had

been lost, strengthened people beyond ordinary capacity, and empowered His servants for extraordinary accomplishment.

Yet supernatural speed must never be separated from **God's purpose and God's timing**.

We are not called to run merely because we want to get somewhere faster.

We run because there is a race to finish.

We advance because there is an assignment to fulfil.

We redeem time because our lives belong to God.

We move because the Kingdom has a mission.

Therefore, this month is not about **speed for speed's sake**.

It is about:

DIVINE EMPOWERMENT FOR PURPOSEFUL MOVEMENT.

THE 17 DAYS OF SPEED

The first seventeen days of September will be observed as a focused season of **fasting and prayer**, tagged:

17 DAYS OF SPEED

This season is designed to help believers intentionally seek God concerning supernatural strength, movement, acceleration, advancement, recovery, fulfilment, and Kingdom purpose.

The emphasis is not on manipulating God into giving us everything immediately.

Rather, we position ourselves before God in prayer and faith, trusting His wisdom and timing while declaring our confidence in His ability to empower us beyond ordinary limitations.

CHAPTER ONE

THE HAND OF THE LORD UPON YOU

Theme Scripture

1 Kings 18:46 (KJV)

“And the hand of the LORD was on Elijah; and he girded up his loins, and ran before Ahab to the entrance of Jezreel.”

Biblical Foundation

Elijah's supernatural speed began with the hand of the Lord upon him.

The Scripture deliberately identifies the source of his extraordinary capacity.

Elijah had natural legs.

He had a natural body.

But the capacity he demonstrated was beyond what ordinary human strength could explain.

The hand of the Lord was upon him.

Throughout Scripture, God's hand represents His active involvement, power, favour, guidance, and enabling.

Supernatural speed therefore begins not with human effort but with **divine empowerment**.

When God gives an assignment, He can also supply the grace and strength required to fulfil it.

Key Truths

- Supernatural speed begins with divine empowerment.
- God's hand can give unusual strength and capacity.
- Divine acceleration is not produced by human pressure.
- God's empowerment is connected to His purpose.
- We depend upon God's strength rather than our own ability.
- The hand of God upon a person can produce extraordinary results.

Living the Truth

Depend upon the hand of the Lord.

Do not measure what God has called you to do only by your natural capacity.

CHAPTER TWO

STRENGTH BEYOND HUMAN CAPACITY

Theme Scripture

Isaiah 40:29 (KJV)

"He giveth power to the faint; and to them that have no might he increaseth strength."

Biblical Foundation

God does not merely work through people who already possess sufficient natural strength.

He gives power to the faint.

He increases the strength of those who have no might.

This is one of the great principles of divine empowerment.

The limitation of human strength does not constitute a limitation upon God's ability.

The believer learns to depend upon a strength greater than his own.

Supernatural speed therefore includes supernatural **capacity**.

Sometimes God's empowerment does not initially look like running faster.

It looks like receiving strength to continue.

It looks like having grace to carry a greater responsibility.

It looks like accomplishing what seemed impossible.

It looks like being sustained when natural strength has been exhausted.

Key Truths

- God's strength is greater than human weakness.
- Divine strength can increase human capacity.
- God supplies strength for His assignments.
- Weakness does not disqualify us from God's purpose.
- Dependence upon God releases confidence.

Living the Truth

Stop defining your capacity only by your natural strength.

Look to God as your source.

CHAPTER THREE

RUNNING IN THE STRENGTH OF GOD

Theme Scripture

Isaiah 40:31 (KJV)

“But they that wait upon the LORD shall renew their strength; they shall mount up with wings as eagles; they shall run, and not be weary; and they shall walk, and not faint.”

Biblical Foundation

Scripture connects waiting upon the Lord with renewed strength.

The result is movement:

They mount.

They run.

They walk.

This gives us another dimension of supernatural speed.

God does not merely empower people for a momentary burst of activity.

He can give sustained strength for the journey.

The ability to run without being overcome by weariness is itself a form of divine enablement.

Supernatural speed is therefore not frantic activity.

It is **strengthened movement**.

Key Truths

- Waiting upon God renews strength.
- Divine strength produces sustained movement.
- God gives grace to run without being overcome by weariness.
- Spiritual strength precedes effective movement.
- The believer can advance without depending solely upon natural energy.
- God's strength enables endurance as well as acceleration.

Living the Truth

Learn to draw strength from God.

CHAPTER FOUR

Theme Scripture

Zechariah 4:6 (KJV)

“Not by might, nor by power, but by my spirit, saith the LORD of hosts.”

Biblical Foundation

The Kingdom of God is not ultimately advanced by human might or natural power.

It is advanced by the Spirit of God.

The Holy Spirit empowers believers to accomplish what human strength alone cannot accomplish.

This is particularly important in understanding supernatural speed.

Divine speed is not merely increased physical or mental activity.

It is **Spirit-enabled movement**.

The Holy Spirit gives wisdom, strength, courage, discernment, creativity, endurance, and power for Kingdom assignment.

CHAPTER FIVE

SUPERNATURAL STRENGTH FOR THE JOURNEY

Theme Scripture

1 Kings 19:7–8 (KJV)

“And the angel of the LORD came again the second time, and touched him, and said, Arise and eat; because the journey is too great for thee.

And he arose, and did eat and drink, and went in the strength of that meat forty days and forty nights unto Horeb the mount of God.”

Biblical Foundation

Elijah had experienced extraordinary strength in chapter 18, but chapter 19 reveals another important reality:

Even God's servants can become exhausted.

God's answer was not condemnation.

He provided what Elijah needed for the journey.

The journey was too great for him in his own strength.

But God supplied supernatural provision and strength.

This is important for our understanding of speed.

Sometimes supernatural speed means God gives us the strength to cover a distance or accomplish a task that would otherwise overwhelm us.

The supernatural is not always spectacular.

Sometimes it is **sustaining grace for a long journey**.

Key Truths

- God's servants have human limitations.
- God knows the demands of the journey.
- Divine provision accompanies divine assignment.
- God gives strength for what He calls us to do.
- Supernatural strength includes endurance.
- God's grace sustains us through demanding seasons.

Living the Truth

When the journey seems too great, do not conclude that you cannot continue.

Look to God for the strength and provision necessary for the journey.

CHAPTER SIX

SUPERNATURAL ACCELERATION IN THE JOURNEY

Theme Scripture

John 6:21 (KJV)

“Then they willingly received him into the ship: and immediately the ship was at the land whither they went.”

Biblical Foundation

The disciples were in the middle of a difficult journey when Jesus came to them.

When they willingly received Him into the ship, Scripture says:

“immediately the ship was at the land whither they went.”

This is an extraordinary picture of acceleration.

The journey that appeared to remain before them was suddenly completed.

This teaches us that Christ can intervene in the journey of His people in ways that produce extraordinary movement toward an appointed destination.

We should not turn this into a formula that promises instant results in every situation.

Rather, it reveals something about the sovereignty and power of Christ:

He is Lord over the journey.

He can accelerate.

He can shorten.

He can intervene.

He can bring His people into appointed destinations.

Key Truths

- Jesus is Lord over our journey.
- Christ can intervene supernaturally in our processes.
- God can accelerate movement toward an appointed destination.
- Supernatural acceleration is ultimately under God's sovereignty.

- We receive Christ into the journey rather than attempting to control everything ourselves.
- God's power can accomplish in moments what natural processes might require much longer to accomplish.

Living the Truth

Receive Christ into every journey.

Do not walk through your journey as though you are alone.

CHAPTER SEVEN

DIVINE TIMING AND SUPERNATURAL SPEED

Theme Scripture

Isaiah 60:22 (KJV)

"A little one shall become a thousand, and a small one a strong nation: I the LORD will hasten it in his time."

Biblical Foundation

This Scripture gives us an essential balance.

God says:

"I the LORD will hasten it..."

but He also says:

"in his time."

Supernatural speed does not mean impatience with God.

It does not mean forcing outcomes.

It does not mean manipulating circumstances.

It means God can hasten what He has ordained **when the time is right.**

This protects us from confusing faith with presumption.

The believer trusts both **God's ability** and **God's timing.**

Key Truths

- God can hasten what He has ordained.
- Divine speed operates within divine timing.
- God's delay is not evidence of God's inability.
- Faith trusts God's wisdom as well as His power.

Biblical Foundation

Supernatural speed is not only about moving quickly into something new.

There are seasons when God brings **restoration**.

Lost opportunities.

Wasted seasons.

Delayed progress.

Broken structures.

Missed opportunities.

God is able to restore.

Restoration can itself involve supernatural acceleration because God can cause a person to recover ground that appeared permanently lost.

This does not mean every past circumstance will literally be reversed.

Rather, it establishes the biblical truth that God is a God of restoration and that lost seasons do not have to define the future.

Key Truths

- God is able to restore.
- Lost time does not have to determine our future.
- God can redeem broken seasons.
- Restoration may involve accelerated progress.
- God's grace can produce new opportunities.
- Our future is not permanently defined by our past.

Living the Truth

Do not live permanently imprisoned by what was lost.

Look forward with faith toward what God can still accomplish.

CHAPTER NINE

Theme Scripture

Romans 9:28 (KJV)

“For he will finish the work, and cut it short in righteousness: because a short work will the Lord make upon the earth.”

Biblical Foundation

God is committed to His purposes.

Where He has ordained a work, He is able to bring it to completion.

Supernatural speed therefore includes **accelerated fulfilment**.

The emphasis is not merely that things happen quickly.

The emphasis is that God's purposes are accomplished.

This is why believers must distinguish between personal ambition and divine purpose.

The greatest question is not:

“How quickly can I achieve my goals?”

but:

“What has God called me to accomplish?”

When our movement is connected to God's purpose, speed becomes a Kingdom resource rather than merely a personal advantage.

Key Truths

- God is able to finish what He has ordained.
- Divine acceleration serves divine purpose.
- God's purposes cannot ultimately be frustrated.

Biblical Foundation

The power of the Spirit was given so that the disciples would become witnesses of Jesus Christ.

This establishes the ultimate direction of supernatural empowerment:

KINGDOM IMPACT.

Speed matters because assignments matter.

Time matters because people matter.

Opportunities matter because the Gospel matters.

Influence matters because Christ matters.

The Church must therefore be ready to move when God opens doors.

Theme Scripture

Ephesians 5:15–16 (KJV)

“See then that ye walk circumspectly, not as fools, but as wise,
Redeeming the time, because the days are evil.”

Biblical Foundation

Supernatural speed also involves the believer's relationship with time.

God has entrusted us with time, opportunities, relationships, gifts, resources, and assignments.

Wisdom requires us to use them well.

To redeem time is to recognize its value and refuse unnecessary waste.

This does not mean living anxiously or constantly rushing.

It means living intentionally.

A believer who understands divine purpose learns to recognize what matters, prioritize what God has assigned, and act with wisdom.

Key Truths

- Time is a stewardship.

Biblical Foundation

There is a kind of speed that is deeply spiritual:

swift obedience.

God does not merely want us to know His Word.

He wants us to respond to it.

Delay can sometimes become disobedience when God has already made His will clear.

The psalmist says:

"I made haste, and delayed not..."

This is not reckless action.

It is decisive obedience.

When God speaks clearly, the believer should not continually negotiate with what God has already said.

Biblical Foundation

Paul demonstrates purposeful forward movement.

He refuses to remain trapped in what is behind him.

This is a picture of spiritual advancement.

The believer must learn to move forward without being permanently defined by previous failures, successes, disappointments, or seasons.

Supernatural speed includes the grace to **keep moving toward God's purpose.**

Key Truths

- We are called to move forward.
- The past must not imprison our future.
- Purpose requires intentional pursuit.
- Spiritual progress requires perseverance.
- God's calling gives direction to our movement.
- We must keep our eyes on the mark.

Living the Truth

Forget what must be left behind and reach toward what God has placed ahead.

CHAPTER FOURTEEN

FINISHING THE RACE

Theme Scripture

2 Timothy 4:7 (KJV)

Biblical Foundation

“That I may know him, and the power of his resurrection, and the fellowship of his sufferings, being made conformable unto his death;”

Biblical Foundation

September must never become disconnected from the revelation established in August.

The ultimate source of our spiritual life is still **Jesus Christ**.

The Christ we seek to know is the risen and glorified Christ.

The power we seek to live from is the power of His resurrection.

The believer does not pursue supernatural speed as an independent spiritual phenomenon.

We pursue Christ.

We know Christ.

We live from Christ.

And His resurrection power enables us to fulfil the purposes for which He has called us.

The risen Christ is therefore not merely the foundation of August.

He remains the foundation of everything ASK teaches.

Key Truths

- Jesus Christ is risen and glorified.
- The power of His resurrection is a present reality.
- Resurrection power produces resurrection life.
- Resurrection life empowers purposeful living.
- The believer's movement must remain centred on Christ.

Do not pursue speed more than you pursue Christ.

CHAPTER SIXTEEN

MOVING IN GOD'S PURPOSE

Theme Scripture

Ephesians 2:10 (KJV)

“For we are his workmanship, created in Christ Jesus unto good works, which God hath before ordained that we should walk in them.”

Biblical Foundation

God has purpose for the believer.

We are God's workmanship.

We have been created in Christ Jesus for good works.

This means our lives are not random.

There are works God has prepared for us.

Supernatural speed becomes meaningful when it helps us walk in those purposes effectively.

The goal is not to become faster than everyone else.

The goal is to become increasingly **aligned with God**.

A person moving rapidly in the wrong direction is not experiencing biblical supernatural speed.

Therefore:

PURPOSE MUST GOVERN PACE.

Key Truths

- God has prepared works for His people.
- Every believer has purpose.
- Divine speed must remain connected to divine direction.
- Alignment with God is more important than acceleration.

Matthew 5:14–16 (KJV)

“Ye are the light of the world. A city that is set on an hill cannot be hid.

Neither do men light a candle, and put it under a bushel, but on a candlestick; and it giveth light unto all that are in the house.

Let your light so shine before men, that they may see your good works, and glorify your Father which is in heaven.”

Biblical Foundation

The ultimate purpose of our influence is that **God may be glorified.**

The believer is called to shine.

The Church is called to represent Christ.

Kingdom influence requires believers to be available, prepared, faithful, and willing to move when opportunities arise.

Supernatural speed can therefore increase the reach and effectiveness of Kingdom influence.

God may accelerate a person's ministry.

He may open doors quickly.

He may connect people strategically.

He may create opportunities that expand influence.

But influence must always remain subordinate to Christ.

Key Truths

- Believers are called to be light.
- Kingdom influence exists to glorify God.
- Opportunities should be recognized and embraced.
- God can accelerate Kingdom influence.
- Influence without Christ-centred purpose is empty.
- Our good works should point people to the Father.

Living the Truth

Move when God opens the door.

Let every increase in influence become an increase in opportunity to represent Jesus Christ.

CONCLUSION

The Month of Supernatural Speed is ultimately not about becoming obsessed with speed.

It is about becoming increasingly available to **God's power, God's purpose, God's timing, and God's assignment.**

The hand of the Lord was upon Elijah, and he ran.

The disciples received Jesus into the ship, and immediately they arrived at their destination.

God strengthened Elijah for a journey that was too great for him.

The Holy Spirit empowered the disciples to become witnesses to the ends of the earth.

Paul pressed toward the mark.

The Scriptures repeatedly reveal a God who empowers His people to move, advance, endure, recover, fulfil, and finish.

Therefore, our prayer throughout September is not simply:

“Lord, make me fast.”

It is:

“Father, empower me to move according to Your purpose.”

We trust God for:

- supernatural strength;
- unusual capacity;
- purposeful movement;
- divine acceleration;
- recovery of lost ground;
- swift obedience;
- wisdom with time;
- fulfilment of divine assignments;
- Kingdom effectiveness;
- and grace to finish well.

And beneath all of this remains the revelation that governs ASK:

“That I may know him, and the power of his resurrection...”

The risen Christ is our life.

The risen Christ is our power.

The risen Christ is our Lord.

And as we know Him and live from the power of His resurrection, we are empowered to **move forward in God's purpose.**

So September calls us:

MOVE.

Move in faith.

Move in obedience.

Move in the Spirit.

Move in God's strength.

Move in God's timing.

Move toward God's purpose.

Move for Kingdom impact.

And when God gives unusual acceleration:

MOVE WITH IT.

Not by human might.

Not by human power.

But by the Spirit of the Lord.
